### **SCREEN TEXT (Sofia: ) -What are we talking about when we talk about inclusive environmental justice in disability?**

Sofia: When we talk about disability inclusive environmental justice, we cover a series of very broad concepts. For example, when talking about the concept of Environmental Justice, we understand that this concept is nourished by various sources, among which we can mention, in the first place, the theories of justice: whether they are of feminist, liberal, utilitarian, Marxist, natural law origin, anti-colonial among others, linking them to the fields of both the environment and ecology and the effects of climate change. In explaining this, it is necessary to define disability: According to the Convention on the Rights of Persons with Disabilities, disability is an evolving concept that results from the interaction between people with disabilities and the barriers due to the attitude and the environment that prevent their full and effective participation in society, on equal terms with others.

Inclusive environmental justice in disability is one that, from the perspective of law, protects the environment, therefore, people and communities, with an inclusive approach that embraces both the needs and contributions of people with disabilities.

#### **Five Actions for disability inclusive Environmental Justice**

Sofia: How can we advance in inclusive environmental justice in disability? I present 5 actions in which we could advance:

1) Educate yourself

It is important to read books and articles about environmental justice, about inclusion and disability. Acquire knowledge to create new and better capabilities.

2) Create awareness

Communicating with others to raise awareness about disability-inclusive environmental justice is vital, as this will increase the number of people who mobilize and commit.

It should be remembered that awareness must be raised around the accessibility of communications so that people with disabilities such as people who are deaf or blind can have access to discussions and activities on disability-inclusive environmental justice.

3) Lobby

It seeks to constantly meet with the public and private sectors to improve their policies and practices from the perspective of disability-inclusive environmental justice.

4) Carry out judicial activism

Go to court and take legal action with lawyers, so there will be a fight for rights.

5) Carry out legislative activism

It is necessary to improve the laws so that they are more efficient in complying with environmental justice, so that the laws are disability inclusive
